Key Information of the Process

How it works: applying to a UK university or college



1. Applying via UCAS Hub

Register and create an account in UCAS Hub:
www.ucas.com/hub.

- Explore options
- Dive deeper into different subjects
- Start application: key dates, overview of process
- Access to resources by industry experts and resources that will develop your application knowledge and skills

1. Applying via UCAS Hub

- If you've already started application: add the buzzword
- If you are starting the application, click 'Yes' in response to:
 - 'Are you applying from a school, centre or college?'

The application can only be submitted after all areas are completed, including the reference.

1. Applying via UCAS Hub

Taking a gap year

Apply for deferred entry (*ie: apply in this cycle, start course in the next*)

- Same application deadlines as those applying this year
- Choose a start date of 2026 when you add course choice
- Meet the conditions of offer by 3 September 2025 unless the university / college specifies a different date.
- Before applying, contact universities / colleges to check if they consider deferred applications.

Admissions tests

To sit for at the start of academic cycle. To find out more:

www.ucas.com/admissions-tests

- Check registration deadline, when it is conducted, what it includes, deadline for UCAS application
- Typically occur between Aug and Nov.
- Check the courses you are interested in and ensure that you register and sit for the necessary admissions test BEFORE the deadline for the application.

2. Waiting for Offers

- There are 2 types of offer
 - **Unconditional offer:** already met the entry requirements
 - **Conditional offer:** if offer is based on exam results. University / college will update status when they receive your results.
- If you used all 5 choices and did not receive any offers or declines the offers received, you can use 'EXTRA' to apply for more choices, one at a time.
- Unsuccessful: Use 'CLEARING' to apply for more courses.

Application Deadlines

1. By the ACJC Internal deadline
 - **Applicants** must complete the application form and pay for the application. (*Oxbridge applicants please note that the Preliminary Oxbridge Application form deadline is earlier*)
 - **Teacher Referees** must complete the reference letter and fill in predicted grades.
2. Between the 2 deadlines

HECG dept will vet the forms and contact students and teachers about any necessary changes.
3. By the UCAS Official deadline

HECG dept will submit the vetted and edited application form and reference letter with predicted grades to UCAS.

Identify a Suitable Teacher Referee

- The teacher referee needs to write about your ability in a subject that is related to your university course.
- Please approach a subject tutor of one of the subject requirements for the university course.

E.g. Computer Science

Course requirements

No prior knowledge of programming is required.

Computer Science

Required by all Colleges: A Level/IB Higher Level Mathematics

Required by some Colleges: A Level/IB Higher Level in a second or three science/mathematics subjects and/or particular subjects

Request for your Math tutor to write the recommendation letter.

E.g. Human, Social, and Political Sciences

Course requirements

Required by all Colleges: no specific subjects

Useful preparation: An essay-based subject

Request for your tutor of an essay-based subject (Geog, Hist, ELit, GP/KI, Econs) to write the recommendation letter

Request for References and Predicted Grades

(It is the applicants' responsibility to communicate to FTs and your desired Teacher Referee about what is required for the UCAS application. Predicted grades are only applicable for candidates who sat for GCE A'Level in 2024.

- Form Teacher(s):
 - Make a request to your FT(s) to collate your predicted grades from your subject tutors.
 - Let your FT know who your Teacher Referee is
 - Your FT will send the predicted grades to your teacher referee.
- Teacher Referee: enter the predicted grades on UCAS
- In the entire process, you will not be told of your predicted grades as it is confidential.

Request for References and Predicted Grades

TIP1: Let your FT and Teacher Referee know the application deadlines so that the predicted grades will be submitted punctually!

TIP 2: Do ask at least 1 month in advance of the deadlines.

IMPORTANT

You are responsible for finding out if your desired courses of study require admission tests.

It is also your responsibility to find out *when* these admission tests occur, *register* for them promptly and *take* the tests.

Apply Through school / college



The Buzzword to apply as an ACJC student is **TBIYTB2025**



Fill up all fields that are applicable to you



E.g. Passport details, full contact details such as mailing address, full name of all GCE O level subjects, Qualifications, Course choices

Guidelines for UCAS Application Form



Fields that are not applicable can be left blank (E.g. Unique Learner Number, Dual citizenship, Nominated access)



Contact details and postal addresses

(Provide details that allow the university to contact you between Dec 2024 – Aug 2025. Offer letters and admission packages may be sent to this address.)



Singaporean students: Use personal email address. **DO NOT** use ACJC email address.



Foreign students: Consider using address and contact number in home country, email domains that are accessible in your home country

You must enter all your qualifications from secondary education onwards



If you are awaiting your A Level results, please request for your Teacher referee to provide your predicted grades



Personal Statement and Teacher Reference

Guidelines for UCAS Application Form



DO NOT leave applying until the last minute



You do not have to complete the application all at once



Only apply once in a cycle as your new application will be cancelled and you will not receive a refund.



Take note of your UCAS Personal ID.

Guidelines for UCAS Application Form



Fill in Google form after submitting your UCAS application so that the HECG department can keep track of your application.



Oxbridge applicants only need to fill in the 'ACJC Oxbridge Preliminary Application form'.



All other UCAS applicants need to fill in the 'ACJC UCAS Application form'.



Google form for UCAS applicants

ACJC UCAS applicants (excluding Oxbridge applicants) **MUST** complete the 'ACJC UCAS Application' form.

In your form, you indicate the name of your teacher referee so that your application can be linked to your teacher referee.

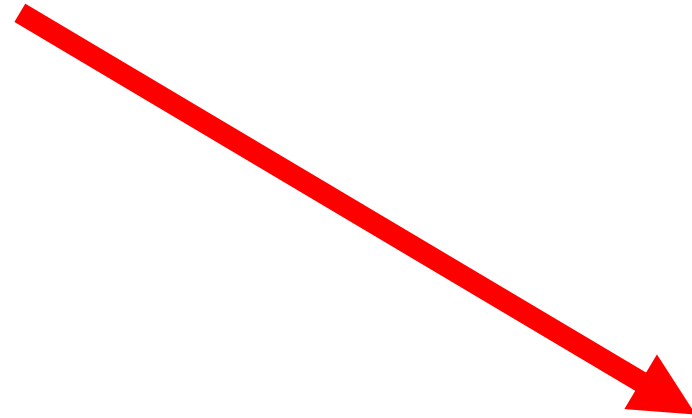

1. Select '**Singapore-Cambridge GCE Ordinary Level**'
2. Type the title of your O level subjects, according to that shown on your O level certificate.

E.g. **English Language** (not English) and Literature in English (not English Literature)
3. Select / Enter the examination body for the subject:
 - **SEAB** – Mother Tongue languages and MT literature
 - **CIE** – English Language , subjects in arts, humanities, sciences, mathematics
4. Enter the date of exams
 - **10/2021** – For MTL taken in sec 3
 - **10/2022** – For all subjects taken in Sec 4
5. Enter the grades as **A1, A2, B3, B4 etc.**, not A, B, C

Education Section – A level Qualifications

1. Select '**Singapore-Cambridge GCE Advanced Level**'
2. Select your A level subject and H1/H2/H3 level from the drop down lists
3. Select / Enter the examination body for the subject:
 - **SEAB** – Project Work, Mother Tongue languages and MT literature, General Studies in Chinese
 - **SEAB-CIE** – GP/KI, subjects in arts, humanities, sciences, mathematics (in H1/H2/H3)
 - **NUS, NTU, SMU** – relevant H3 subjects, e.g. H3 Game Theory
4. Enter the date of exams and grade awarded
 - **11/2023** – PW and H1 MTL (enter the grade awarded)
 - **05/2024 OR 11/2024** – H3 taken, including those from local universities (enter the grade as Pending)
 - **11/2024** – GP/KI and other H2/H3 subjects (enter the grade as Pending)

What you need to know:

- Maximum of 5 choices, but not necessary to fill up all 5
- No order of priority / preference
- Each university will not know of your other options
- All 5 choices will receive the same personal statement
- **Medicine / Dentistry / Veterinary medicine applicants: UCAS allows a maximum of 4 medicine courses, the fifth choice must be non-medical but can be related e.g. biomedical engineering**

Implication: Write about your interest in ONE subject area / career in the personal statement
